



Empowering **vulnerable youth** with skills for sustainable careers, financial independence, and a confident future.

Project Saksham is a skill development initiative aimed at empowering children and young adults from underprivileged and vulnerable backgrounds, including juveniles and children from destitute homes.

The project is being implemented in government-run shelter homes in Lucknow, where beneficiaries receive practical, job-oriented training to help them become self-reliant and lead dignified lives.

Objectives:

- To provide technical, entrepreneurial, and life skills training to underprivileged boys aged 15–21

- To train and certify electricians for employment in local communities and industries
- To support underprivileged girls with beautician training for sustainable livelihoods
- To provide tailoring and stitching training to enable home-based income opportunities



IMPACT OF PROJECT SAKSHAM

Children and students are trained in various skill-development programs such as tailoring, beautician courses, and electrical work. They receive complete modules and structured training to prepare them for employment.

ELECTRICIAN TRAINING

More than 30 young boys have undergone electrician training and received certification to help them build sustainable livelihoods after transitioning out of shelter homes. For lives shaped by juvenile detention or shattered hopes, PEHL brings skills, confidence, and a renewed sense of purpose, helping them start anew.



TAILORING TRAINING

More than **150 young girls** have undergone stitching and tailoring training, equipping them with practical skills they can use to earn a livelihood after transitioning out of shelter homes.

BEAUTICIAN TRAINING

Around 60 girls, along with participants from other skill programs, received training in the beautician sector. This flexible skill enables them to work comfortably and earn a livelihood wherever they are.
