PROJECT SHARAN

When the COVID pandemic swept across the country, it left behind more than just a health crisis – it shattered families and futures. Among the most heart-wrenching consequences was the sudden rise in children who lost one or both parents, left to navigate life without the emotional, financial, and educational support they once had.



370+ children across India

are being supported, and our commitment continues as we guide them through their educational journey until they complete professional or vocational courses.



PROJECT KUSHAAGRA



Today, nearly 10–15% of children globally struggle with challenges such as developmental delays, cerebral palsy, autism, speech and language disorders, and sensory impairments.

Without early intervention, these hurdles can hold them back. With awareness, timely diagnosis, and the right support ; their story can be different. Project Kushaagra, an initiative by PEHL, is committed to building a more inclusive future for children with developmental disabilities.

Over 300 children receive expert guidance from a Developmental Paediatrician and a dedicated team of rehabilitation specialists, ensuring timely intervention and holistic developmental support through our Early Intervention Centres in Mumbai and Lucknow.

IMPACT



300+ teachers and 10000+ students

across government and private schools benefited from the Teacher Mentorship Program, which focused on ADHD, dyslexia, red-flag signs, and effective classroom strategies. The sessions were conducted in multiple government and private schools across UP in the Soraon Block, Prayagraj, and schools in Lucknow including St. Mary's, Meridian Public School, SSLB School, and CB Memorial Public School and etc.

PROJECT SAKSHAM

Through vocational training, course sponsorships, and personalized career guidance, Saksham creates real pathways for children and young adults from destitute homes to step into the world with dignity and purpose.

PROJECT SAHELI



Project SAHELI is our focused initiative dedicated to strengthening the emotional well-being, safety, and self-confidence of underprivileged girls, adolescents, and women through meaningful awareness and counselling programs.

We deliver interactive, age-appropriate sessions in government schools, shelter homes, and marginalized communities; creating safe spaces to talk about crucial topics that are too often ignored but deeply important.

Through the Adivasi Sakhi Project, we've empowered women with menstrual health education and distributed **750+ menstrual cups across 15 villages**, creating a sustainable model for other underserved regions.

500+ girls

have benefited from this project till last year.



PROJECT SHARANAM

Sharanam is an upcoming residential shelter-home for destitute girls aged 6 to 18 years, located in the heart of Kharghar, Navi Mumbai, near the Kharghar Village Metro Station. Built on a foundation of compassion, Sharanam will serve as a safe and nurturing home for up to 50 girls, offering not just accommodation, but care, dignity, and meaningful opportunities for their growth and well-being.

At Sharanam, each girl will be encouraged to feel at home, grow with confidence, and build a future where she becomes a strong and positive contributor to society.

Sharanam is envisioned as a model shelter-home, setting a new benchmark in holistic child development and community-centered care.

It will provide a **safe haven for up to 50 girls**, offering not only shelter but also a sense of belonging, care, and opportunities to grow.

NEWS FROM GROUND



PROJECT SAHELI — COUNSELLING & AWARENESS INITIATIVE

At Balika Vidyalaya, Lucknow, we conducted an interactive session on girl child safety, highlighting NCRB data, causes of missing cases, and cyber safety with responsible social media use. We also clarified common misconceptions around “freedom.”

Grateful to Leena Misra Ma’am for the opportunity. We concluded the visit by planting a mango sapling to symbolize hope and growth.

HONOURED TO SPEAK AT THE IMPACT CME

Honoured to speak at the IMPACT CME by NMOGS at Reliance Corporate Park on “Special & Able.” Shared key insights on developmental and psychosocial needs of children with special needs, emphasizing early red flag identification, timely referrals, ongoing monitoring, and parental counseling.



BKN COUNSELLING DAY — FOCUS: EMOTIONS

Conducted counselling at BKN with a focus on emotions, including a group session on patience and perseverance using an art-based activity (paper quilling), along with individual counselling sessions held in the morning.





HELPING CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

PEHL and the team conducted a developmental screening at Sishu Grah, Lucknow on 21st March. Dr. Archana Srivastava and Dr. Anjana Thadani carried out neurological assessments, TDSC screening, and anthropometry for children aged 0–6 years. Notably, about 35% of the children did not pass the screening. Our next step is to train caregivers in early intervention techniques under close supervision.


TEACHER TRAINING

Conducted a teacher training workshop for 90 government school teachers from Block Soraon, Prayagraj. The session focused on child development and its link to school readiness, along with autism and dyslexia screening. It was encouraging to see that teachers were already aware of many red flag signs, our role was to help connect the dots and provide a clearer, complete understanding.



TEACHER MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

The Teacher Mentorship Program was launched at Meridian Public School, Lucknow, with a focus on screening children in school and implementing classroom modifications to support their needs.



GOALS OF 2025-26

Establish an Early Intervention Centre for children with special needs in Mumbai.

Expand free medical check-up camps for all girls at Bal Kalyan Nagri.

Provide essential medical facilities and health check-ups to impact 5,000 people across the Raigad district.

Obtain necessary permissions for Sharanam Shelter Home and initiate its physical construction.
